WHAT DO I DO IF MY STUDENT IS SICK?

It is important for you to keep your student(s) home when they are not feeling well. If you have any questions about whether your student should come to school, practice or athletic games/meets, the best decision would be to keep them home and contact the school nurse to discuss your concerns.

What do I do if my student is sick?

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or trouble breathing
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Sore Throat
- Unusual fatigue
- Runny nose or nasal congestion
- Headache
- Muscle or body aches
- Nausea (feeling sick to the stomach)
- Loss of taste or smell

Student has ONE symptom:

Student must stay home.
Parent must call district & school nurse.

Student has TWO or more symptoms:

Student **AND** siblings* must stay home.
Parent must call district & school nurse.
**siblings include all children
residing in the household*

How long will my student(s) need to stay home?

Students must have clearance from the school nurse before returning to school **AND** be symptom free for a minimum of 24 hours (without medication).

Parents must contact the school nurse to discuss a return plan.

What do I do if my student is tested for COVID-19?

*Stay home. All members of the household should **home quarantine** while awaiting test results. Parents must contact the school nurse with results and to discuss a plan to return to school. Parents must submit test results to the district.*

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What do I do if my child tests negative for COVID-19?

Contact the school nurse to discuss your child's symptoms and to determine a return date for your student(s). Submit test results to the school nurse.

What do I do if my student has close contact with a person who tests positive for COVID-19? ** Revised for student athletes. See below

All members of household stay home. Contact the school nurse. Home quarantine for 14 days since last contact with affected person. If you or your children develop symptoms, contact your health care provider for testing.

What do I do if my student or household member tests positive for COVID-19?

Affected person and household member must home quarantines for 10 days from date symptoms started or the test date. All household members must home quarantine for an additional 14 days. Contact the school nurse with test results.

I can't afford a COVID Test; is there any assistance available?

If you do not have a doctor, call 211 to be connected to resources that can help you access testing and care. Many clinics in Wisconsin provide services for people with little or no insurance.

My student is sick, but I don't want him/her tested for COVID-19?

If a student exhibits 2 or more of the symptoms listed and you choose not to test for COVID-19, the student will be on leave for a minimum of 14 days. Parents must contact the school nurse to determine a return date.

My student has a history of allergies and/or migraines. Does my student need to stay home?

If your student is exhibiting any of the symptoms listed, your student must stay home. Contact the school nurse to discuss your student(s) medical history and return plan.

My student needs to stay home for an illness/symptom not listed. Do I still need to contact the school nurse? Yes - Communication is key. Please contact the school nurse so that we can update your student's medical records.

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2020-2021 SCF Winter Athletics Return to Play/Practice Guidelines

- 1 All athletes must test for COVID if they have 2 or more symptoms.
2. All athletes who had direct contact with a person who tested positive for COVID (not in the same household) are quarantined for 14 days. They must test for COVID no sooner than day 7 or 8 from their last contact with the person, but before the end of their quarantine. If they have symptoms they may test sooner.
3. All athletes who had a household member test positive for COVID must test for COVID just prior to the end of their quarantine. If they have symptoms they can test earlier.
4. If the athlete chooses not to test, the entire team will begin a 14-day quarantine.
5. The School nurse must clear all athletes to return to practice. Parents/guardians must provide the nurse with a copy of the test results.
6. Once athletes return to practice, they will start the return to play protocol per the athletic trainer. When they complete the protocol, they can return to full competition.
